Ludovica La Rocca, architect, is a PhD candidate in Urban planning and Evaluation at the Department of Architecture (DiARC), University of Naples Federico II and co-founder of the Blam collective.

Her research-action activity investigates the opportunities generated by the hybridization between urban regeneration processes and social innovation, identifying cultural heritage as a field of application.

With the Blam collective and the DiARC, since 2018 she activated the SSMOLL project, a process of adaptive reuse of a church in the historic centre of Salerno, in the South of Italy, through the implementation of a creative and cultural Living Lab. Since 2019, with Blam, she promoted the Play ReCH project, a hybrid enterprise for the enhancement of cultural heritage through gamification approaches.
